Former Board Member Remembered

Don Samull, former TPA Board member passed away on March 5, 2009. He did not fully recover from surgery in the fall. He was very active in many Detroit Polonia events and was well known for his annual Polish American calendar. The Mass of Resurrection for him was at the historic Sweetest Heart of Mary Catholic Church in Detroit. Don was usually present at our Dozynki celebrations with a table selling Polish items and calendars. Remember Don and his family in your prayers.

Helena Modjeska (Modrzejewska)

The Polish communities here and in Poland are commemorating the 100th anniversary of her death. Modjeska was a celebrated Polish-American Shakespearean actress of the 19th century. She was a dominant force in Polish theater and prominent in Warsaw high society. Leaving Poland for personal and political reasons, she founded a utopian community in California. Modjeska was considered by many critics to be the best American female Shakespearean of that time and was compared to Edwin Booth. She was a godmother to Ethel Barrymore and her fame extended beyond her theatrical performances. A memorial Mass was celebrated on April 5th at St. Stanislaus Catholic Church in New York and a historic plague was unveiled in her memory. This was the same church where her funeral mass took place and it is the oldest Polish Catholic Church in Manhattan. Her remains were taken back to Poland in 1909 for burial.

TPA Annual Meeting

We had two very interesting speakers: Lidia Bosek-Ebersole spoke on the customs of Poland as they are today.
